Advice received: -

If birds are becoming a nuisance, for public Health & Safety or causing serious damage, it is possible that they can be controlled under license.

If it is occurring on private property, then it is up to the individual to organise this.

You first need to identify the species concerned and see if they are covered by a general licence or not. For a general license, there is no application process. It is up to the individual to be be/use a license holder and operate under the terms of the license.

There is an online screening process A09 which will say whether you will be granted permission or not.
